

2013 Tundra Unit Review

Format

Part 1 – Multiple Choice

These questions will be taken directly from the notes.

Example: During the winter months the sun often stays in the sky for:

- 1) 24 hours 2) 12 hours 3) 0 hours

Part 2 – Short Answer

These questions require multiple parts. They are usually worth 2-5 marks. A questions that is worth 3 marks will have 3 separate parts/sentences.

Example: Name 3 of the 5 map rules for creating a map (3 marks).

Part 3 – Long Answer

This (usually one) question will be worth 5-10 marks and have multiple parts. It can be in essay format or a long activity.

Example (Essay): Describe how drilling for oil would benefit tundra communities now, but probably ruin their environment in the future.

Example (Activity): Create a climate graph from the data. Use the graph to describe the climate.

Material Covered

1. Maps – How to draw maps and where the tundra region is located.
2. Climate graphs – How to draw and read.
3. Maritime and continental climates
4. Plants and growing seasons
5. Seasons and the sun
6. Soil in the arctic
